Robert (Bob) J. Mollenhauer was appointed director of development for the College of Natural Resources and Environment at Virginia Tech in December 2008. Mollenhauer came to Virginia Tech after having served as vice president at both Roanoke College in Salem, Va., and at Slippery Rock University, a member of the Pennsylvania State System of Higher Education.

At Slippery Rock University, Mollenhauer directed the successful \$33 million Campaign for Slippery Rock University and had overall direction for fundraising, public relations, and alumni relations. He also established RockNet, an interactive career services network; initiated the President's Advisory Council, a team of senior executives who advise the president; and managed the upgrading of the alumni magazine.

Mollenhauer has served as executive director of corporate and foundation relations at the University of Pittsburgh; director of development at Colorado College in Colorado Springs, Colo.; and director of development for the River Campus at the University of Rochester in Rochester, N.Y. While at the University of Rochester, Mollenhauer also served as the head baseball coach.

Mollenhauer was the head baseball coach at Brockport State College in Brockport, N.Y., and at Middlesex Community College in Bedford, Mass. His teams won more than 100 games in his coaching career and participated in the NCAA Tournament in 1990. Mollenhauer played professional baseball for five years in the Oakland Athletics minor league system, earning California League All-Star status in 1975.

Mollenhauer managed a Competitive Employee Training Act (C.E.T.A.) program for disadvantaged students and served as a wilderness instructor at Wilderness Ventures, a travel camping program for high school students.

He earned a master of education degree in counseling at Boston University and a bachelor of arts degree in English and psychology from Lafayette College.

Mollenhauer and his wife, Laurie, live in Roanoke, Va., and have two sons, Dale and Brett.
